

The building and construction industry, vital to our economy and infrastructure, constitutes 4% of total GDP. However, it faces a severe labor shortage, set to worsen with 41% of the US construction workforce retiring by 2031. Additionally, there's a significant gender gap, with women holding only 11% of jobs. Addressing this gap not only provides women with stable, valuable careers but also establishes a talent pipeline to strengthen the industry in the long term.
